Addendum 1 Wheeler County Small Business Revitalization Grant Guidelines

Foreword

Wheeler County recognizes the importance of social distancing measures in protecting the health and safety of our communities and slowing the spread of the COVID-19 pandemic. While these social distancing measures will save lives, they have also come at great cost to Wheeler County's small businesses and their employees.

The **Small Business Revitalization Grant Program** was established by the Wheeler County Court for the purpose of providing one-time, short-term financial support to small businesses and organizations impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Eligibility Criteria

Eligible Entities:

To be eligible to apply for this grant funding opportunity the applicant must operate within Wheeler County, be able to demonstrate financial hardship due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and be one of the following:

- Registered, For-Profit Businesses, including Home-Based Businesses
- Non-Profit Organizations
- Fraternal Organizations

Allowable grant fund uses include:

- Employee Payroll & Benefits
- Building Lease or Mortgage Payments (excludes home-based businesses)
- Equipment Lease Payments
- Utilities
- Business Insurance
- Covering costs resulting from compliance with applicable Executive Orders

General Guidelines

The Small Business Stabilization Grant Program is administered by Wheeler County Economic Development.

Stabilization Grants are intended to serve as a funding bridge to cover essential business expenses and costs associated with Covid-19 response. Applicants are expected to seek out and apply for federal and state resources as they become available.

Stabilization Grants are not intended to address long-term economic recovery needs nor to fully replace lost business income associated with the pandemic.

Review Process & Funding Decision

Applicants must submit a completed Application Form and related support material. Incomplete forms will not be accepted.

Applications will be submitted to Wheeler County Economic Development Department.

The Wheeler County will convene a Small Business Stabilization Committee consisting of representatives from Wheeler County Court, Economic Development, Emergency Management, City of Mitchell, and City of Spray.

The Small Business Stabilization Committee will:

- Determine applicant eligibility. Only eligible applicants will be considered for funding.
- Review applications for completeness and accuracy. Incomplete applications will not be considered for funding.
- Seek clarification or additional information from applicants as necessary.
- Make funding decisions.

Funding decisions are at the sole discretion of the Small Business Stabilization Committee. The Committee reserves the right to award funds at a reduced level from what is requested in the application. The Committee's funding decision is final.

Agreements

Successful applicants will be required to sign a Grant Agreement, which outlines the allowable uses of funds and reporting requirements, prior to release of funds. Failure to comply with the requirements outlined in the Grant Agreement may preclude an applicant from being eligible for future grant offerings.

Reporting

Successful applicants will be required to report to Wheeler County as outlined in their Grant Agreement. Failure to meet the reporting requirements of the Grant Agreement may preclude an applicant from being eligible for future grant offerings.

Application Deadline

Applications can be obtained from and submitted to Wheeler County. Applications will be due no later than December 18, 2020.
